

The producer of these discs can control how they are played so you may not always be able to control play as described in these operating instructions (for example if the play time is not displayed or if a Video CD has menus). Read the disc's instructions carefully.

## CD-R and CD-RW discs

This unit can play CD-R/RW (audio recording disc) recorded with CD-DA, video CD, SVCD (conforming to IEC62107), WMA, MP3, or JPEG. Close the session or finalize after recording.



- Remove discs from their cartridges before use and return them when you are finished, making sure that the labels of the disc and cartridge face the same way.
- •Some parts of the disc, for example where one program ends and another begins, may not play smoothly.



## •To conserve power

When the unit is not going to be used for a long time, disconnect the AC power supply cord from the AC outlet.

The unit consumes a small amount of power (approx. 0.9 W, when in the multi cradle) when in standby mode.

When you create a HighMAT CD using compliant PC software, you can make playlist settings and also record text information such as titles and artist names. File searching is made easy using CDs recorded in HighMAT through use of a versatile navigation system. CDs recorded in HighMAT can also be played on your PC.

This unit is compatible with HighMAT discs containing WMA, MP3, or JPEG data, There are some differences from other WMA/MP3/JPFG discs

#### Bitstream

The digital form of multi-channel data (e.g., 5.1 channel) before decording.

A decoder restores the coded audio signals on DVDs to normal. This is called decoding.

#### **Dolby Digital**

This is a method of coding digital signals developed by Dolby Laboratories. Apart from stereo (2-channel) audio, these signals can also be multi-channel audio. A large amount of audio information can be recorded on the disc using this method

#### **Dolby Pro Logic**

#### DTS (Digital Theater Systems)

This surround system is used in many movie theaters around the world. There is good separation between the channels, so realistic sound effects are possible.

#### Dynamic range

Dynamic range is the difference between the lowest level of sound that can be heard above the noise of the equipment and the highest level of sound before distortion occurs.

#### Film and video

DVD-Videos are recorded using either film or video. Usually, film is recorded at 24 frames per second, the rate movies are filmed at, while video is recorded at 30 frames per second.

#### Frame still and field still

Frames are the still pictures that make moving pictures. About thirty are shown each second. A frame still may appear blurred but overall quality is high.

Two fields appear alternately to make up one frame. A field still is not blurred but picture quality is lower.

#### Interlace and progressive output

NTSC, the video signal standard, has 480 interlaced (I) scan lines, whereas progressive scanning uses twice the number of scan lines. This is called 480P

#### I/P/B

MPEG 2, the video compression standard adopted for use with DVD-Video, codes frames using these 3 picture types.

- I: Intra coded picture
  - This picture has the best quality and is the best to use when adjusting the picture.
- P: Predictive coded picture This picture is calculated based on past I or P-pictures.
- **B:** Bidirectionally-predictive coded picture This picture is calculated by comparing past and future I and P-pictures so it has the lowest volume of information.

## Linear PCM (pulse code modulation)

These are uncompressed digital signals, similar to those found on CDs.

#### Playback control (PBC)
